EVENT SCHEDULE

Rock Island Greenway (Bike Trail) – Monthly Clean Ups for 2nd Quarter

The Peoria Park District now manages the Rock Island Greenway Adopt-A-Trail program. Their guidelines are that we do monthly visits to our section of the trail and do visible litter pick up, check the general condition of the trail, and advise park district staff on any needed repairs or maintenance. Two annual broader clean ups are to include the entire width of the trail corridor including beyond the trail pavement and shoulders. For the Rock Island Greenway clean up events of our club's adopted trail section we will meet in the

Heritage Square parking lot facing Prospect Avenue. Many of the cleanups will likely end with a trip to Trefzgers

Saturday April 1, 2017, Noon – 2 pm. This is one of our semi-annual major clean-ups. We will focus on going off trail in and around the ditch outside of Trefzgers. There is also some litter in the ditch on the other side of trail from that point. We will likely get muddy. So, please wear boots and bring an additional pair of clean shoes.

Monday, May 15, 2017, 6 pm – 7 pm

Monday, June 16, 2017, 6 pm – 7 pm

Our clubs adopted section of the Rock Island Greenway starts at Prospect Avenue and goes south to Miller Avenue. As noted above, the monthly clean ups during the first quarter of 2017 will precede one of the local hikes on the same day during January, February and March. Each monthly cleanup will take only about half an hour with just a few volunteers needed. Little equipment will be needed, only a small trash bag and a litter picker. The monthly clean ups will focus on the asphalted trail path only. ***So, the monthly clean ups will not count toward getting the Muddy Boots award.*** Our 2017 first semi-annual clean up will be in April with the second one occurring in the fall. ***The semi-annual clean ups will count toward getting muddy boots award*** and the dates will be communicated in the Newsletter.

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2017-07, April 9, Sunday, 2:00 pm, Springdale Cemetery, Peoria

Historic Springdale is the premier cemetery in the Peoria area with beautiful and varied landscapes. This walk will be circular, covering 5 miles/2.5 hours of roads, sidewalks, savannah, woods, plus a future part of the Rock Island Greenway. Shorter, self-directed return options are available. There are hills. The early spring provides Illinois River views. Group signs have bios of some buried luminaries. Wear relatively light clothing since the hike is exerting. Don hiking boots for off pavement. Mud may be a minor issue. Consider trekking pole(s) if you need aid with the terrain. Carry water. Bathrooms are not available. Leashed dogs are welcome. Park inside the cemetery near the main entrance building at 3014 N. Prospect Rd. either in the small parking lot or along the right side of cemetery roads (stay off the grass). Optionally, the club may dine afterward at an eatery.

2017-08, April 22, Saturday, 6:00 am, Lake Geneva, WI Shore Path. Meet behind the Cracker Barrel restaurant at 105 E Ashland on the north side of I74 in Morton. We will leave promptly at **6 am. RSVP early to Brian Cunningham at 309-633-1224 by Tuesday 04/18 for the group "road trip".** We may arrange for a passenger van if we have an adequate number of hikers. If we do not have enough RSVPs for the van we will car-pool rather than vanpool.

The hike will begin at **9 am** from ***Gordy's Boat House Bar and Restaurant at 336 Lake Ave in Fontana, WI.*** Car parking is available down 3rd Ave one and two blocks to the west. The Lake Geneva Shore Path hugs the circumference of Lake Geneva and is a marathon (26 miles) in length. We will hike just the northern half on Saturday 04/22/17. We will meet and begin our hike from the town of Fontana on the western point of the lake. We will hike 2 miles to Williams Bay and take the 10 am 50-minute tour of the Yerkes Observatory. The cost is \$8. After the Yerkes Observatory tour we will hike to Harpoon Willie's along the path for lunch and then resume our hike on to the town of Lake Geneva. Hikers should bring a light snack and fluids. We expect to return to Morton by approximately 9pm.

2017-09, May 6, Saturday, 9:00 am, Marquis Oak Ridge Trail Hike. We will meet at the parking lot at the base of the bridge in Lacon, IL at 8:30 am. The new Marquis Oak Ridge Trail at TWI's Dixon Waterfowl Refuge at Hennepin & Hopper Lakes is a 2.7 mile crushed-gravel trail, designed for hiking and bicycling, leads from the levee at the north end of the site through rich prairie and wetlands to the newly restored Oak Ridge marsh and savanna complex at the center of the Refuge. Hikers who complete the trip will be rewarded with a scenic view over the restored marsh from a low wooden viewing platform situated among the savanna trees. It's one of the best spots for viewing migrating waterfowl at the Refuge. Lunch after the hike will be at the Pizza Peel in Lacon.

2017-10, May 21, Sunday, 1:30 pm, Funks Grove, McLean IL

Funks Grove is a 1000+ acre area southwest of Bloomington and a favorite destination for Pimiteoui. In addition to hiking, maple syrup is extracted here and is sold at the nature center and the main store in Shirley IL. We'll walk 4.5 miles on relatively level ground through forest and prairie. A 1.5-mile turnaround is available. Wear hiking boots, bring water and bug spray. Trekking pole(s) may not be necessary. Bathrooms are at the beginning. Leashed dogs are welcome. Carpooling is at 1:30 pm at the back lot of Cracker Barrel in Morton. If driving directly, contact the hike leader beforehand, arrive at Funks Grove by 2:30 pm, and park at the Sugar Grove Nature Center, 4532 N 725 East Rd., in rural McLean. An overflow lot is nearby. Post hike will likely include food at a restaurant on the return trip.

If not dining with the club, drive separately or hitch a ride with a non-eater, and you should arrive back in Peoria by 6:00 pm. For non-GPS directions from Bloomington, see <http://sugargrovenaturecenter.org/directions.html>

2017-12, June 24, Saturday, 8:00 am, Matthiessen State Park, Oglesby/Utica IL

Returning to Matthiessen is always as picturesque treat. Near Starved Rock, it's where the locals prefer going. We shall walk at least 4 miles/2.5 hours at the bottom of the dells, the upper woods surrounding them, and along the lake. This hike has moderate inclines—plus several steep wooden stairs—but the main challenge lies in the upper dell while stepping on stones and cement pads especially if the water level is high. Mud also can be a major issue in both dells. There is one convenient turnaround point close to halfway. Be prepared with hiking boots, 2 trekking poles, water, bug spray, plus hat, camera, and binoculars if desired. Bathrooms are at the beginning and about mid-way. Leashed dogs are welcome, but small ones may need carrying on the stairs. Carpooling is at 8:00 am at the Washington Kroger parking lot, 20 Cherry Tree Shopping Center, near the gasoline corner. Those travelling directly should contact the hike leader beforehand and arrive at the park by 9:30. Hiking will commence at 9:45. Directions: go north on I39, take exit 48 at Tonica, turn right (east) onto N 20th Rd, come to a T and turn left (north) on Route 178, go several?? miles and turn left into the Matthiessen Dells Area (not the Vermilion River Area, which is the first one), and drive back to park. After hiking, we'll dine in Utica. For those staying to eat, we should get back to Washington by 4:00 pm.
