Look for the 'Archery Range' sign to find the archery range/hiking trail parking lot.

More specific directions: From Rte 29, drive east (away from the river) on Edgewater Dr (IL-98) for about 1.6 miles. Look for the archery range sign on the north (left) side of Edgewater Dr (IL-98). Drive up the short/steep gravel road to the archery range / hiking trails parking lot. No rest rooms or water at the park. Dogs are ok.

Trails are moderately hilly, due to river bluff terrain. Trails also include some flat / meadow areas and a few water crossings (with bridges). All very nice indeed. I plan to hike about 1.5 to 2 hours. I suggest bringing drinking water and hiking poles.
