Saturday, July 26, 9:00 AM, Spring Creek Reserve beginning at Grosenbach Road trailhead

Address: 22222 Grosenbach Rd, Washington IL

Join us for a hike at Spring Creek Reserve starting at 9 AM. Water, boots, and poles are recommended. It will be a fairly easy hike along the valley floor; there is one significant uphill stretch at the end.

Directions: Do NOT go to the main trailhead off Spring Creek Road. Instead, we will use the South trailhead on Grosenbach Rd. If coming from the west (Peoria) or south, head toward Metamora on 116 and turn right on Grosenbach Rd a short distance NE of the McClugage bridge. From the east (Washington), turn right on Grosenbach from Route 24 just before the strip of businesses across from ICC.

We will meet in the Parking Lot near Rt. 29. Coal Hollow Park is a newer park and has a series of short trails, most 1 mile long or less. This will be a fairly easy hike, and we can adjust the length of the hike to adapt to the group. Pets are allowed, but you must clean up after your pet.

Address: ½ mile north of Progress St. on Coal Bank Rd, Metamora, IL

We will hike for about 1½ to 2 hours on some of the beautiful trails in this park. Bring a hiking stick and water. Dogs are permitted on a leash.

Sunday, September 14, 2025, 1:00 PM, Farmdale Reservoir (Mike-n-Don's and Schrolls Loop Trails)

Address: 810 W Bittersweet Rd, Washington, IL (Google maps is slightly off but you will see the parking lot at the bottom of the hill)

This is a 4.1-mile circular trail. Generally considered a moderately challenging route, it takes an average of 1 hr 23 min to complete. We will walk an hour out and an hour back. This is a popular trail for birding, hiking, and walking, but you can still enjoy some solitude during quieter times of day. Dogs are welcome but must be on a leash. Hiking is allowed but this trail is best suited for mountain bikes, so we may encounter them. The trail is well-maintained and moderately trafficked. It is open year-round, but it can become muddy after heavy rain, so wear appropriate footwear. Restrooms and picnic tables are available at the trailhead, making it a convenient spot for families or groups.

Address: Jonah's, 2601 N Main St, East Peoria, IL

The hike from Jonah's Seafood to Cooper Park North in East Peoria, IL, is a pleasant walk along the Illinois River Road, which is also part of the River Trail of Illinois. The trail is flat and offers views of the

river and wetlands. It can be accessed behind Jonah's restaurant and extends north to Spindler Marina and beyond. The trail includes a boardwalk with observation decks overlooking the wetlands.

We will meet at the parking lot behind Jonah's. The trail itself is fairly flat but well maintained and you can hike a long way. It's out and back so decide how long you want to walk and turn around before you get too tired. Dogs are welcome on a leash.
